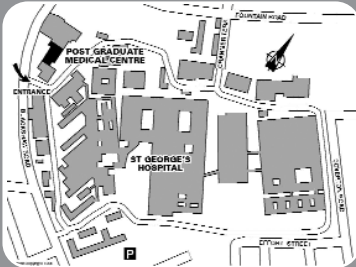
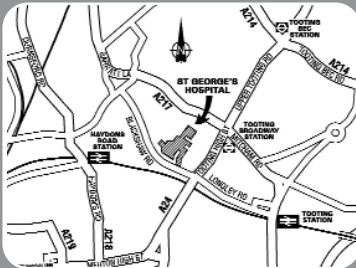

HOW TO FIND US



The Dental evening lectures take place in the Education Centre and it is equipped with modern technology, air-conditioned and can accommodate 60 delegates. The hands on courses are usually held in the skills lab.

The Education Centre is also home to the St George's Advanced Patient Simulator (GAPS) is a new facility at St George's Hospital London, introduced to enhance multi-professional training in patient management. GAPS currently provide patient simulation training using the METI high fidelity Paediatric and Adult patient simulators. Practitioners would be able to perform a range of practical skills required for the safe management of medical emergencies within dental practice by working in simulated crisis situations / medical emergencies. All simulation training is closely linked with our Patient Safety Training (PST).

How to find us

From Central London, take the Northern Line south to Morden and get off at Tooting Broadway station which is a five minute walk from the hospital.
