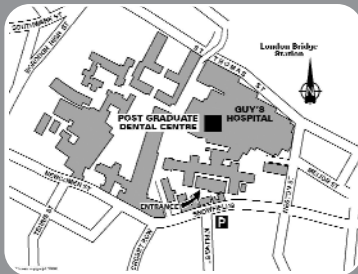
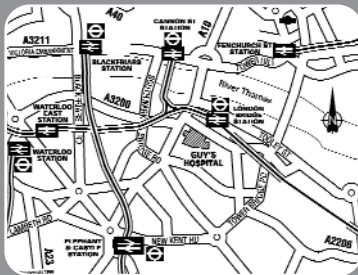

#### By public transport
