



National Clinical Apprenticeship Placement Scheme (CAPS) for Refugee Doctors

The aim of CAPS is to prepare you for Foundation Training and improve your chances of getting a job as a doctor in the UK.

The CAPS scheme is endorsed by the **UK Foundation Programme Office** and delivered by **London Deanery**.

We are offering medical work placements in the NHS, intensive education and generic skills training. You will gain a good understanding of Foundation competences and assessment procedures.

As a scheme endorsed by the **UK Foundation Programme Office** it will ensure that those who successfully complete the scheme are recognised as suitable for competing for Foundation Posts or to apply for specialty training.

This advertisement is for placements for the period from August 2012 to February 2013 (6 months).

For applicants living **inside** the London Deanery area:

Eligibility Criteria:

1. Applicants must have refugee status or leave to remain on the basis of an asylum claim; evidence required.
2. Applicants must have passed PLAB 2 within the last 18 months and have full GMC registration; evidence required
3. Applicants must have permission to work in the UK
4. Applicants must live within the London Deanery area; evidence required (e.g. Utility bill, copy of signed rental agreement, council tax bill, etc.)
5. Applicants must have NOT participated in the following London Deanery schemes:
 - had a PRIME or Supernumerary Foundation placement;
 - attended the Clinical Experience Scheme;
 - attended FY1 Orientation Course for Refugee Doctors

Other important information

- Placements are for 6 months in London: 5 months in an Acute Trust and the final month in Primary Care.
- Dates for the placements are provisionally: 1st August 2012 – 1st February 2013
- Placements are paid as a supernumerary Foundation doctor at a basic/minimum Foundation Year 2 salary.
- There will be no funding for transport, child care or accommodation.
- **Closing date for applications 25th May 2012 at 5pm** (please include two references from UK doctors)
- **Shortlisted candidates will be notified by 1st June 2012**
- **Interviews provisionally are on 11th June 2012** in London.
- Candidates will be expected to fulfil the whole programme before references can be obtained. If any candidate wishes to speak to a previous participant about the scheme, this can be facilitated upon request.
